"I am the good shepherd [who] lays down his life for the sheep." (John 10:11-18)

The fourth Sunday of Easter is known as Good Shepherd Sunday. Today also marks ANZAC Day. There is a particular link between the readings for Good Shepherd Sunday and our Commemoration of ANZAC Day. Jesus is the Good Shepherd and says that he will lay down his life for his sheep. In a similar way, we remember all people who sacrificed themselves so that we could be free.

There is a striking opportunity for both aspects of the day to be interwoven. The Collect implores that the humble flock may reach where the brave Shepherd has gone before. The notions of bravery and laying down one's life are at the heart of both Jesus' words in the Gospel and the commemorative activities that take place on ANZAC Day. The Paschal Mystery of Jesus is an event that is unparalleled in human history, however, it constantly renews and reinvigorates the events of our own times.


The use of the word 'sheep' in the Gospel is not in anyway Demeaning or dehumanising. Rather it goes to the essence of our very human need to be loved, and to feel secure in that love. No less than God in the person of Jesus Christ is waiting for us, keeping us in view, watching over us, protecting us from the bad wolves of the world.

Our relationship with the Good Shepherd is not based on money; Jesus has not been paid to look out for us. It is a gift, waiting to be unwrapped, waiting for us to answer his call, waiting to bring us to God.



The love that God gives is the self-sacrificing love of the cross, seen from the perspective of resurrection faith.

How do we experience God's love? As a gift? Or as something to be earned?

Acts 4:8:12

Filled with the Holy spirit, Peter said: 'Rulers of the people, and elders! If you are questioning us today about an act of kindness to a cripple, and asking us how he was healed, then I am glad to tell you all, and would indeed be glad to tell the whole people of Israel, that is was by the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, the one you crucified, whom God raised from the dead, by this name and by no other that this man is able to stand up perfectly healthy, here in your presence today. John 10:11-18

Jesus said:

I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep.

The hired man, since he is not the shepherd and the sheep do not belong to him, abandons the sheep and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf coming, and then the wolf attacks and scatters the sheep; this is because he is only a hired man and has no concern for the sheep. I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, just as my Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for my sheep.

And there are other sheep I have that are not of this fold, and these I have to lead as well.

They too will listen to my voice, and there will be only one flock, and one shepherd.

The Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again.


