They all ate and were satisfied, and they picked up the fragments that were left over — twelve wicker baskets full. Matthew 14: 13-21

"Take this bread . . . "

People of every time & place & culture have taken grain from the earth & ground it into flour, kneading it with water, salt & yeast, to make bread.

The job of the baker is to make bread taste great by extracting as much flavour as possible from its ingredients. It's done in a simple, ancient process, Fermentation, that is quite possibly responsible for the origin of life on Earth.

Active yeast feeds on the sugars released from the wheat after it has been hydrated. As a result, it releases a gas and a tangy liquid sometimes called 'hooch.' Fermentation literally transforms the ingredients from one thing into another. The baker's job is to keep that yeast alive until it is time to bake, where it releases its last 'breath,' giving a final rise to the loaf, and then dies in the hot oven. **The yeast dies to give life to the bread**, **which is then consumed and gives life to us** ...

In the baking and breaking of bread we have an opportunity to experience the mysterious relationship between life and death in both profound and ordinary ways. Wheat is alive until harvested and milled. The yeast dies under high heat. The ingredients transform it into something else. The substance that emerges from the oven is something that it wasn't before. It becomes bread, a food so substantial and nourishing that it can even mean food itself. By breaking and eating it we are given life, not just the nutrients needed to sustain physical life, but what we need to sustain a spiritual life as well.

The very baking of bread mirrors the mystery of Christ as the compassion of God made human for us: the elements of bread come together and "die" to become bread as Christ dies to rise bringing all of humankind to the fullness of life in God. Bread is a living sign of what it means to be church: we come together with our gifts and talents, and, by the "yeast" that is the Spirit of God, we become the one bread, the Church, the body of Christ.

In imitating Jesus' three actions in today's Gospel, blessing" and giving thanks for what God has given to us, "breaking" from our blessings (including our time and energy) in order to contribute to the good of all, and "giving" in joy and humility, we transform our small offerings of fish and pieces of bread into the means for becoming the one body of Christ.

Liturgy of the Word - 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year A

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

O God, come to my assistance; O Lord, make haste to help me! You are my rescuer, my help; O Lord, do not delay.

FIRST READING

Isaiah 55:1-3

Thus says the Lord: Oh, come to the water all you who are thirsty; though you have no money, come! Buy corn without money, and eat, and, at no cost, wine and milk. Why spend money on what is not bread, your wages on what fails to satisfy? Listen, listen to me and you will have good things to eat and rich food to enjoy. Pay attention, come to me; listen, and your soul will live. With you I will make an everlasting covenant out of the favours promised to David.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM R. The hand of the Lord feeds us, he answers all our needs.

1. The Lord is kind and full of compassion, slow to anger, abounding in love. How good is the Lord to all, compassionate to all his creatures.

2. The eyes of all creatures look to you and you give them their food in due time. You open wide your hand, grant the desires of all who live.

18TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Through the power of God, Jesus was able to share five loaves and two fish with a crowd of five thousand people. Today he shares himself with us through the Eucharist, the bread of everlasting life.

SECOND READING

Romans 8:35.37-39 Nothing can come between us and the love of Christ, even if we are troubled or worried, or being persecuted, or lacking food or clothes, or being threatened or even attacked. These are the trials through which we triumph, by the power of him who loved us. For I am certain of this: neither death nor life, no angel, no prince, nothing that exists, nothing still to come, not any power, or height or depth, nor any created thing, can ever come between us and the love of God made visible in Christ Jesus our Lord.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia! No one lives on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God. Alleluia!

GOSPEL

Matthew 14:13-21 When Jesus received this news he withdrew by boat to a lonely place where they could be by themselves. But the people heard of this and, leaving the towns, went after him on foot. So as he stepped ashore he saw a large crowd; and he took pity on them and healed their sick. When evening came, the disciples went to him and said, `This is a lonely place, and the time has slipped by; so send the people away, and they can go to the villages to buy themselves some food'. Jesus replied, `There is no need for them to go: give them something to eat yourselves'. But they answered, `All we have with us is five loaves and two fish'.

LET US PRAY

Jesus, help us to share whatever we have with others and not to be greedy in any way. As we remember our brothers and sisters in other countries who have no food, We pray that the rest of the world will leave to share, too, so that the world can be a happier place. Bring them here `to me' he said. He gave orders that the people were to sit down on the grass; then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven and said the blessing. And breaking the loaves he handed them to his disciples who gave them to the crowds. They all ate as much as they wanted, and they collected the scraps remaining, twelve baskets full. Those who ate numbered about five thousand men, to say nothing of women and children.
